

ABJJ/Wolfpack is coming to the Valley!

ABJJ in partnership with Primal Marital Arts will be expanding our program to Wasilla in mid to late January. For the first time, Valley residents will have access to high quality BJJ and MMA instruction in their own backyard at one of the largest dedicated martial arts facilities in the state. “ABJJ’s dedication to helping their students become their very best and their consistent ability to produce champions compliments the standards we have established in our highly successful Taekwondo Program.”, Master Shearer of Primal Martial Arts.

The primary instructor will be ABBJ purple belt Paul Sturgeon. Paul brings a wealth of BJJ experience to the school. He has previously taught in Kenai and on the North Slope and is an AFC veteran. In addition, this exciting and dynamic program will use supplemental instructors so expect to see some of the best fighters in the state such as Kevin Barber and Rob Yundt as well as senior members of the ABBJ staff there teaching.

The class will be part BJJ and part MMA. The optional MMA portion of the class will be geared towards novice fighters. As the student progresses they will be able to come train with the pro team in Anchorage and will have access to our resources. BJJ students will also be part of the team and we will provide ranking and belts using the strict but rewarding standards they have in Brazil. ABBJ is known for their methodical teaching method of both BJJ and MMA and preparing students to be competitive at a national level.

This program will be an extension of the Anchorage school, students will be able to train at either location depending on what is most convenient for them.

When: Classes will be three times a week for two hours per class
